Boneseed Blitz and Tussock Termination!

Sunday 13 September

Meet at 9am Dunalley Canal and back to the Neighbourhood House by 12.30pm for a bbq!

The Tasman Landcare Group is joining Scouts Tasmania, Marion Bay Coast Care and Landcare Tasmania for a morning's work in fire affected areas around Dunalley, Connelly's Marsh and Boomer Bay. The aim is to continue follow-up weed control along some of the coastal areas burnt in the 2013 bush fires. This is important to ensure that the weeds don't get the chance to get a hold again! We'll be splitting up into teams to take on a variety of jobs in different areas, and there will be activities for all levels. The main jobs will be searching for and removing boneseed, and looking for serrated tussock and chipping it out with a mattock or hoe!

Don't worry about identifying the weeds. We'll go over that before starting, and you'll find that you'll pick it up quickly.

Marion Bay Coastcare will also be holding their monthly working bee at Boomer Bay Jetty from 10am for those that want to meet there.

Meet at 9 am at the Dunalley canal near the toilets, to register and meet your site supervisor. You will need: Sturdy footwear, clothes for any weather, hats/beanies and work gloves, drinking water. Tools such as mattocks may be useful. Queries 0418 354 919.
